TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE REPORTS

William Ashton, Committeeman

Mr. Ashton provided the following report:

1. The baseball president resigned however, other volunteers have stepped up and everything is under control. Unfortunately, a coach could not be found for the Babe Ruth Team and these players had to go to Millville. He is optimistic to get baseball going next year.

3. Mr. Ashton stopped at the shipyard and spoke to them about the parking problem and they are agreeable to allowing the fire company to have a key to the gates on Carlisle & Meadow for emergency purposes.
4. Mr. Ashton has received information that someone is looking to develop a business on their property and they are optimistic to pursue a business opportunity in the township.

Ken Whildin, Deputy Mayor

Mr. Whildin provided the following report:

1. Movement on repurposing dredge spoils is slow moving but progressing with a possible plan by 2021.
2. The business sign for the Mauricetown Causeway is in the works.
3. Presently there is a dispute between CCTech and the Vo-Tech that is being worked out.
4. The Cumberland County Sheriff's Department will be doing bike patrols in the township this summer.
5. A non-profit wildlife organization will, in the future, take into consideration that MRT is already 56% tax exempt when examining properties for their acquisition.
6. Public Works installed a seepage pit on Moores Beach Road.

J. Roy Oliver, Mayor

Mr. Oliver provided the following report:

1. Pinelands & NJDEP are leaning to formally close the landfills. If HDSRF grant funds are awarded the landfills will be placed in 'remediation' status by NJDEP and this will prompt an annual fee of \$22,500 for each landfill until the remediation is complete. HDSRF grant funds have been applied for in the amount of \$258,000 for Landfill #1 and \$214,000 for Landfill #2.
2. USEPA also has a program called Targeted Brownfields Assessment wherein USEPA will supply the contractor to do the assessment work on the landfills. Utilizing this program will delay the designation of 'remediation' and therefore, no NJDEP annual fees will apply.
3. The first feral cat trapping resulted in 54 cats being trapped, spayed/neutered, ear tipped, vaccinated, microchipped and released. Kittens were taken to shelter for adoption. The next max trap (50 cats) is scheduled for April 23rd. An ordinance introduction will be reviewed by the Township Committee later this year with possible grant application made in January 2020 to continue the program
4. A conference call was held with NJDEP representatives to discuss rescinding the easement on the Sapello Foundry. Projects that are proposed for this site are moving the recycle center here to free up the current property for business development; this will require only .95 acre on Sapello site. Also, a soccer field for use by the school and a recreation area for public use are proposed. A back-access road for the school is also being examined; the road will exit on Weatherby Road. The Township Engineer is being

asked to create a conceptual plan that incorporates all of these items for the Sapello property. Mr. Oliver also asked Mr. Morrissey to check into grant funding or state aid to assist the school in paying for their portion of the proposed back access roadway.

5. The Ackley remedial work will start later this month. The block from the building will be tested and if contaminated it will be disposed of accordingly but if it is not contaminated it will possibly be reused as fill at the dike area.
6. The Township Committee has determined and offered additional properties to the NJDEP as part of the Matts Landing land swap negotiations. These additional township owned properties are of no use to the township and are primarily wetlands properties.

ALLEN FOSTER, CMFO

1. Review of 2019 Municipal Budget

Mr. Foster explained that the local tax will go from .446 to .441 (1/2 cent decrease) for budget year 2019. This tax figure is for local tax portion only and does not include the county or school portion. Mr. Foster reported the state aid being received is the same as last year and revenue is also the same as last year. No surplus is being used compared to last year. There is no significant increase in appropriations. Public works department salary is showing the primary increase due to promotions as well as public works operating expense increase. Overall there was a reduction in the budget due to not having to account for the \$40,000 match. The road program is still being paid down with no debt issued.

Mr. Foster stated concerns for the township the heavy reliance on state aid; should this be lost or decreased there will be a tax increase. Another concern is the taxable valuation decrease in the amount of 2 million and no increase in revenue. Health benefit costs are also a concern

Mr. Oliver explained that the Township Committee is meeting with a Vicinage representative on May 8th to discuss a shared service/merger of the Municipal Court possibly with the Commercial Court. Ultimately the decision will be based on where the bottom line falls.

Mr. Oliver offered that an emergency repair was needed to the Leechester Hall roof recently but longevity of the roof is in question. Mr. Foster stated that a new roof will need to go out for bid due to exceeding the bid threshold but it can be done as a capital improvement with no impact to the budget.

Public Hearing of the 2019 Municipal Budget Resolution #54-2019

Mr. Oliver stated that the local tax is only 18% of the overall tax rate; 82% is county and school.

PROFESSIONAL REPORTS

Engineer

Mr. Morrissey provided the following report:

Bricksboro Bulkhead – A pre-construction meeting will be coordinated to take place in the next two weeks. The Parrish's and Valentine's will be invited to attend.

2018 Road Program & Newell Road – Phase 1 – A pre-construction meeting has been scheduled for April 30th with South State.

Basketball Court – A pre-construction meeting has been scheduled for April 24th with the contractor Ricky Slade.

Moores Beach Drainage – The seepage pit has been installed and will be monitored.

Cumberland Vol. Fire Septic – The fire company has decided to proceed with the modified design. An engineer will need to do the redesign. The Township Committee approved for Mr. Morrissey to proceed with this redesign work for the Cumberland Volunteer Fire Company.

Front Street Emergency Access – Mr. Morrissey provided a summary evaluation to the Township Committee. Mr. Morrissey explained that a road way that is only 20 feet wide does not support parking on the roadway. Mr. Morrissey further recommended that the employees of the shipyard discontinue parking in front of the buildings (along the roadway). Mr. Morrissey recommends a Knox box be installed at the shipyard gate which will allow for fire company access in any emergency.

Thompsons Beach Bike Path – Mr. Morrissey recommended applying for a bike path grant through NJDOT. Mr. Larry Niles, ALS, is exploring grant opportunities through NFWF.

Newell Road Phase 2 – Grant award was received from NJDOT in the amount of \$224,679.

Sapello Property Development – The soccer field is permitted on Green Acres properties. auxiliary use (recycle center) is permitted but is not certain about the driveway. Mr. Oliver explained that .95 acres would be used for the recycle center with the remaining property would be used for the soccer field and public recreation area; minus the area needed for the driveway. Verification from Pinelands is needed for the intended use; Tiffany Morrissey, Township Planner, is going to talk to Sue Grogan at Pinelands for this information. Mr. Morrissey added that stormwater management measures will need to be addressed; any impervious cover would require additional stormwater management measures.

Mr. Ashton asked if drainage is included in the plan for Newell Road paving. Mr. Morrissey stated that one pipe that is failing will be replaced with seepage pits being utilized in other areas.

Mr. Oliver asked Mr. Morrissey his suggestion on “no parking” on Front Street particularly the shipyard employees. Mr. Morrissey recommended talking to the shipyard regarding the employee parking and specifically no ‘angle’ parking.

Solicitor

Mr. DiDomenico stated that he processed a quit claim deed for one of the DeCarlo lots.

Mr. DiDomenico stated the survey and legal description has been received to vacate a section of Stable Street in Port Elizabeth. Mr. DiDomenico will prepare the ordinance to vacate this section of Stable Street. Mr. DiDomenico explained this portion of the street is covered in vegetation and there is a pipe running underground which will require an easement for access. Mr. Morrissey advised that 20 feet will be needed to access the pipe. It was discussed that should the property be purchased by the contiguous owners they will not be permitted to build within the easement area. The entire section is only 33 feet wide.

Mr. DiDomenico stated he has sent the letter to Theodore Baker, Cumberland County Solicitor, advising that Maurice River Township will retain control over their right of ways in regards to 5G.

Mr. DiDomenico will draft an ordinance eliminating the one-way designation of Carlisle Place, Front and Meadow Streets. This new ordinance will reinstitute the previous two-way and no parking as determined by the Township Committee.

Mr. Oliver announced that the Hartley property designation as a Brownfields site has been reversed by the Township Committee due to negative title search showing around \$250,000 in liens on the property. The liens would need to be repaid if the property were to change title.

NEW BUSINESS

1. A letter was received from the NJ Department of Transportation dated March 25, 2019 announcing that Maurice River Township was selected to receive 2019 Municipal Aid for Reconstruction of Newell Road – Phase 2.

Second Public Comment Session

Mr. Whildin made a motion to open the second public comment session noting the time at 8:31 pm; seconded by Mr. Ashton.

Roll Call: Ayes – Whildin, Ashton, Oliver Nays – None

Mr. Joe Haase, Haase’s Marina & Haase’s on Route 47, stated he was there on behalf of his parents who own Haase’s Marina. Mr. Haase stated that there is no active lease between the state and his parents due to lack of oversight by the NJDEP. Mr. Haase further explained that during the period of 2009-2012 the state issued Special Use Permits for use of the property and nothing has been formally received since 2012 (no Special Use Permits or lease agreement). Mr. Haase questioned a letter received from the township advising that the township was going to sell the property. Mr. Haase further questioned the calculation of taxes on the property; the

buildings are owned by his parents but the land is owned by the NJDEP; why are they responsible to pay taxes on the land owned by the NJDEP. Mr. Haase provided copies of past tax bills to the Township Committee and Mr. DiDomenico for review. Mr. Haase stated that he believes the negotiations with NJDEP for the township to acquire the marinas will go nowhere. Mr. DiDomenico expressed that the recent action on this seems encouraging compared to previous attempts to remedy the situation.

Mr. Oliver recommended a meeting to discuss the tax calculating method used with the Tax Collector and Tax Assessor in attendance. The Township Committee determined to hold a special meeting with all marina operators in attendance, the Township Solicitor, Tax Collector, Tax Assessor and all Township Committee members. The meeting was set for Thursday, May 9th, 2019 at 5:30 pm; the clerk will advertise and send notices to the marina operators. Mr. Oliver advised Mr. Haase that additional properties were sent to the NJDEP toward the land swap negotiations but the Township Committee is considering making a cash proposal to the state for the property. Mr. Oliver explained that the ultimate goal is to get the property to the marina operators and part of the agreement will be to upgrade the wells and septic systems.

Mr. Haase expressed that after Hurricane Sandy his parents used \$75,000 of their own money with no assistance. Mr. DiDomenico added that the negotiations with the state are optimistic because in 2010 they were only willing to accept money now they are willing to accept property. Mr. Oliver concluded by stating the Township Committee is committed to resurrecting the Matts Landing area.

Mr. Whildin made a motion to close the second public comment session noting the time at 8:53 pm; seconded by Mr. Ashton.

ORDINANCE NO. 682

CALENDAR YEAR 2019

**ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS
AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK
(N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)**

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Committee of the Township of Maurice River in the County of Cumberland finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2019 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Committee hereby determines that a 3.5 % increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$29,625.40 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Committee hereby determines that any amount authorized herein above that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Committee of the Township of Maurice River, in the County of Cumberland, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2019 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Maurice River shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$103,688.91, and that the CY 2019 municipal budget for the Township of Maurice River be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

**AN ORDINANCE OF MAURICE RIVER, COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of Maurice River, Cumberland County, previously adopted Ordinance No. 580 amending the Uniform Construction Code Fees and repealing Ordinance No. 541; and

WHEREAS, the Maurice River Township Committee now proposes to revise portions of said Ordinance to update the required New Jersey State Permit Surcharge Fees.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of Maurice River Township, Cumberland County, New Jersey that Ordinance No. 580 (Uniform Construction Fees), as adopted and codified as Ordinance Section 11-1.3d, is hereby amended as follows:

Section 11-1d: New Jersey State Permit Surcharge Fee

The fee shall be \$0.00371 per cubic foot volume of new buildings and additions. Volume shall be computed in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:23-2.28. The fee for all other construction shall be \$1.90 per \$1,000.00 (\$0.00190 per dollar) of value of construction.

1. No fee shall be collected for pre-engineered systems of commercial farm buildings.
2. No fee shall be collected for permits to perform asbestos abatement or lead abatement.
3. No fee shall be collected for permits for the construction or rehabilitation of residential units that are to be legally restricted to occupancy by households of low or moderate income, as defined in N.J.A.C 5:43-1.5.
4. No fee shall be collected for demolition of buildings or structures.
5. No fee shall be collected for work consequential to a natural disaster when the local code enforcement agency is waiving its fee.
6. The minimum permit surcharge fee shall be \$1.00.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all remaining portions of Ordinance No. 580, and as codified as Ordinance Section 11-01, are reaffirmed and shall remain in full force and effect.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Township Committee of the Township of Maurice River, County of Cumberland and State of New Jersey that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon the adoption and publication of notice of adoption as prescribed by law.
