Mr. Oliver stated that guess speaker of the Pinelands Municipal Alliance meeting last month, Matt Pisarski, talked about the Battle of Dallas' Landing. This is an archeological exercise. On June 25, 2015 a presentation will be made of what has been made.

Mr. Oliver stated that on Monday, Gordon Gross, Steve Hagemann and himself evaluated the sluice gate on River Road. Mr. Oliver stated that it is believed that the county will provide the collar that is needed and Allen Steel has provided a quote of \$200 for the gate.

## Professional Reports

### Engineer

Mr. Cormac provided the follow update on projects.

Matts Landing Bike Path - the wetlands delineation has been completed. Also survey work has been started. The design plan should be completed in May.
Leechester Drainage - survey work was done to look at the drainage. Discharge would most likely be toward the swell at the back of the public works building. Bubble up discharge is pending. This should give positive drainage during a rain event.
Search Grant - Snap shot of where we are at this point. Defining each area was done first. The first plan on Port Elizabeth shows that it goes unto the north. Much of this area is owned by the Nature Conservancy and a fair amount of it is wet. Define the service area by population zoning and commercial are items that are evaluated to determine sewerage need. Zones here are PVC3, Village Business district along Route 47. Along Route 47 provides the commercial gain. The PVC5 area is a bit more confusing. Others areas to establish service are on the other side of the Manumuskin but this would not be cost effective. Other determinations are the two streams and environmental sensitivity areas. Providing for a gain of commercial area is important. Location of the sewage treatment must be evaluated for viability.
There are some areas that have the potential for surface water discharge. It is interesting that the area around the Wawa, Citgo and proposed Dunkin donut area are not included in the study. Township must acquire land to locate the treatment facility. The Sapello Foundry has stipulations and also the adjoining properties; has proper soils and is isolated. Types of treatment plants must be evaluated. Types of treatment options will depend on location whether CAFRA or Pinelands. CAFRA nitrate dilution standard is 10 parts per million while in Pineland the nitrate dilution standard is 2 parts per million. There is a lot less relief with Pinelands. Two treatments are dependent on the volume of flow.
Leesburg/Dorchester is closer to 118 thousand gallons per day. There are millions of gallons at other facilities.
Mr. Morrissey explained the type of treatments being media filter treatment where it is run through a series of filters and the reactor which is slightly more expensive.
Mr. Sarclette asked would this effect the build out or increase the potential build out? Would this be a concern at the Land Use level? Mr. Cormac said zoning could be adjusted to get more lots.
Mr. Morrissey stated that Leesburg/Dorchester there is a lot of residential build out and opportunity would be to pick up sewerage service area on Route 347 near Carlisle Place Road. Also consideration in the cluster division.

Mr. Morrissey evaluation must be made regarding the number of people impacted versus the cost to build the sewerage treatment.

There are three delivery systems; one is the gravity system which will require evaluating the elevation levels. Mr. Morrissey stated that property near the Whibco Site #2 which is an undeveloped area.

Mr. Sarclette stated that the committee will evaluate the packet supplied by Mr. Morrissey.

Sluice Gate – Mr. Morrissey will remove from his project list. Mr. Morrissey did advise that the gate should be monitored.

Mr. Sarclette advised that the public works department has been advised to check the gate regularly.

Mr. Sarclette explained the situation that is transpiring where two neighbors are disputing the placement of personal property on the township paper street, Happy Street. Both property owners have had surveys completed and the surveys do not match. Mr. Sarclette asked that Dixon Associates evaluate the surveys and verify the surveys done. It appears that either one or both took the readings from the incorrect control marker.

Mr. Morrissey stated that field measurements will need to be taken.

Mr. Sarclette asked the committee if okay to proceed with preliminary work. The Township Committee consensus was to proceed with the preliminary work by Dixon Associates.

Mr. DiDomenico stated that Mr. Gross has copies of both surveys. Mr. DiDomenico stated that Mr. DeFabrites of MV Engineering believes he worked from the correct marker.

Mr. Sarclette states the township has no interest in Happy Street other than it is township property.

Mrs. Wells also stated that there is a drain higher than the roadway near her house which does not allow rain water to flow in. Mr. Sarclette stated he will check out this situation.

Mr. Morrissey asked how close they are to finishing Thompsons Beach. Mr. Sarclette stated they are still working but must stop when horseshoe crabs come ashore.

Mr. Stowman stated that he recently advised someone that you can walk down to the beach but you cannot drive. Mr. Sarclette verified that the gate will remain and that pedestrians and bicycles are permitted.

Mr. Sarclette was questioned regarding driving from "Return the Favor" crew regarding turning over horseshoe crabs. The ordinance states the area is closed from May 1<sup>st</sup> to June 8<sup>th</sup>. The East Point Beach is still accessible during this time.
